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New EHE Administrator

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Service Initiatives

- **HealthTec (HT)**
Telehealth HIV care supported by devices, internet access, and training.
- **Quick Connect (QC)**
Rapidly links newly diagnosed or out-of-care individuals to HIV treatment; HIV education provided to non-RWP clinicians; Positive Peers social media app; additional media campaign.
- **Housing Stability Services (HSS)**
Short-term rent, utility, and job training and placement assistance for people with HIV facing housing instability.
- **Mobile GO Teams (MGT)**
Expedited HIV care in high-incidence areas delivered through mobile units.

Program Goals

- Increase timely access to quality HIV medical care for people with HIV, regardless of income or county of residence.
- Increase in the number of people with HIV who adhere to their HIV treatment regimen.
- Achieve housing stability and reduction of barriers affecting program clients' ability to remain treatment adherent (e.g., take HIV medications daily as prescribed).
- Increase ability to rapidly respond to HIV clusters and outbreaks.

Program Highlights

FY 2025 EHE Statistical Highlights

- 727 new clients enrolled across subrecipient organizations
- 827 clients achieved viral suppression during this period
- 1,235 clients were prescribed antiretroviral therapy (ART)
- 495 clients were served under housing programs

HRSA EHE Comprehensive Site Visit

- Site Visit held February 18–20, 2026
- Stakeholder Meeting - organizations met and discussed the program with HRSA staff
- Client Focus Group – hosted at Borinquen Health Care Center
- Three Findings and CAP Responses:
 - Contract executions
 - Evaluation plan
 - Consent form language

EHE Reports

- All reports (RSR, Triannual, Biannual Progress, and FFATA) were submitted on time.
- Data extraction issues with subrecipients were successfully resolved.

Looking Ahead & Next Steps

FY 2026 Contract Extensions

- Work is underway to finalize contract extensions by the end of May 2026.
- Current contracts set to expire February 28, 2027, will be replaced by new agreements subject to the results of the upcoming RFP.

On-Site Technical Assistance Meetings

- The EHE Administrator will be reaching out to subrecipients to schedule select in-person technical assistance sessions with program staff.

Comprehensive Site Visits

- Comprehensive subrecipient site visit reports will be finalized over the coming months.
- Subrecipient site visits for FY 2026 are expected to be scheduled for Fall/Winter 2026.

- The EHE RFP will be available in Summer 2026, alongside the Part A / MAI release.
