



Contingency Planning in Response to AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) Funding Cuts

As of April 20, 2026

From January through April 2026, the Partnership approved a series of motions as contingency planning in preparation for pending changes to AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) funding.

The phased roll out of these actions, if implemented, will be communicated to Ryan White Program subrecipients and the Partnership by the Miami-Dade County Office of Management and Budget Grants Coordination/ Ryan White Program (Recipient). The order of items listed below does not indicate the implementation order.

General

- To grant the Recipient the discretion to provide a phased approach to funding changes in response to pending ADAP implementation of programmatic changes.
- To reduce the Federal Poverty Level eligibility from 400% to 350% for the Ryan White Part A and Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI) Program.
- To defer the approval of the Psychosocial Support Services and Outreach service descriptions as presented and to review further updates in the future when the services are being provided.
- To recommend as contingency planning under the Part A budget, the revised allocations by percentages indicated on the Miami Dade County Ryan White Program FY 2026-27 Part A Funding Ceiling Budget Edits For Contingency Planning.
- To recommend as contingency planning under the MAI budget, the revised allocations by percentages indicated on the Miami Dade County Ryan White Program FY 2026-27 Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI) Funding Ceiling Budget Edits For Contingency Planning.

Medical Transportation (Ride-Share)

- To remove ride share services from the Part A Medical Transportation service.
- To remove ride-share services from the MAI Medical Transportation service.

Outreach

- To eliminate the Part A Outreach allocation.
- To remove the allocation for MAI Outreach.

Oral Health Care

- To cut the Part A Oral Health Care service allocation in half and to allow the Medical Care Subcommittee to provide input on priorities and reduced services included in the Oral Healthcare Formulary.
- To remove implants from the Ryan White Oral Health Care formulary.
- To reduce the oral health care cap to between \$1,500-\$2,000, depending on the rate of expenditures at the time of implementation.
- Subject to availability of funds, for urgent or emergency circumstances that an annual expenditures cap override be developed by the Office of Management and Budget and that Oral Health Care subrecipients will provide information on whether or not the service is an emergency; if it affects function; the consequences of delay in treatment; and a treatment plan of care.

Other Services

- To reduce the maximum annual allowance of the Part A Substance Abuse Residential days from 180 to 120 days.
- To eliminate the Part A Health Insurance Premium and Cost Sharing for Low-Income Individuals allocation.
- To reduce the Part A Food Bank allocation to \$500,000.
- To reduce the Part A Medical Case Management allocation to \$3.5 million.
- To reduce the Part A Legal Services allocation to \$25,000.
